This innovative and collaborative course will delve into the concept of 'inner drive' from clinical, physiological, and behavioral points of view. Four gifted and experienced occupational therapists, along with a panel of experts in the field, will explore the scope, breadth, and relevance to practice of inner drive from different perspectives and theoretical frameworks.
